MOP1- Noted that ECC have not addressed the issues concerning the red squirrels/proposed tree works and are not following the necessary requirements. Stated that ECC would not get a licence from Natural England. WMTC should have their own risk assessments and data for the red squirrels and ECC should be made aware that there are protocols which need to be followed.

MOP2- Stated that red squirrels should be protected by the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981. The Council should publicise the law protecting the habitat. WMTC in conjunction with East Mersea Parish Council should consider applying for TPO's. Suggested the council adopt a policy of replacing a tree if removed with one other semi mature tree. Requested a meeting to close issues relating to VG241.
