MINUTES OF THE COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON THURSDAY 23 JULY 2026

The Mayor asked out of respect for the 41-year-old mother who tragically lost her life yesterday, her 15-year-old daughter who also passed away, and their family member (7-year-old) who remains in a critical condition, that those who are able please stand for one minute's silence. 26/180 To receive apologies for absence and a vote of acceptance to be taken

Apologies received and accepted from Cllr Webster and City Cllr Davidson.

26/181 To record declarations of interests

Members are invited to declare any relevant interests. Notwithstanding this item, Members may subsequently declare an interest at any point during the meeting

Cllr Powling declared he was a Colchester City Councillor and on duty, requiring his phone to stay turned on.

26/182 Public session (15 minutes, 3 minutes per speaker)

Priority will be given to those members of the public wishing to share information relating to items on the agenda. Once the public session is closed, members of the public are not permitted to speak

MOP1- Raised concerns following the tragic incident on the beach, asking that the Council discuss installing clearer beach safety signage at their next internal meeting. Highlighted past fatalities, the general lack of public understanding about tides and rip currents, and the need for visual, child-friendly warnings placed at an accessible height.

MOP2- Thanked the Mayor for his thoughtful remarks and reflected that the past 24 hours had shown both the best and worst of society, including instances of disgraceful online hate. He asked councillors to consider creating a book of condolences to reflect the community's shock, sorrow, and its wish to show support to the bereaved family.

MOP3- Noted that the coroner is expected to issue firm beach-safety recommendations and that standard Coastguard and RNLI signage is already available. Outlined longstanding concerns about parking pressures, emphasising historic access rights for local medical practice and the impact of recent changes and rising demand on the Co-op car park. He proposed that the Town Council explore creating a new community car park—potentially via village green deregistration and Section 106 funding—to support key local services. He added that the British Legion's offer of one hour's free parking is only a temporary measure, as the Council has no control over the land.

MOP4- Raised 3 matters: proposing a trial one-way system around the town centre following the bus route to create additional short-stay free parking for residents, visitors and traders; recommending that the Council's Policy on Complainants be amended to ensure it does not restrict individuals raising legitimate concerns about breaches of legislation, statutory duties or public safety; and providing detailed advice regarding signage and safety on the foreshore, including the removal of WW2 defence blocks via a marine contractor with support from relevant public bodies, highlighting current safety risks to beach users and watercraft, referencing past incidents and prosecutions, and emphasising the Council's responsibility to ensure adequate warnings and mitigate hazards.

26/183 To receive County and City Councillors report

Report received from County Cllr Chris Perera: -

- Judicial review on local government reorganisation ongoing; major cost concerns.
- Mixed views on the 100-day plan; GP provision for Mersea highlighted as critical.
- Essex Housing Committee proposed; net-zero commitments potentially dropped for savings.
- Opposition to Wethersfield Asylum Centre expansion; support for veterans' village.
- Increased pothole repairs and highways investment; contractor performance questioned.
- A1331 link road enabling large housing growth; infrastructure concerns for Mersea.
- Motions on oak tree protection, housing targets withdrawal, and safeguarding Green Belt supported.
- Significant issues with school placements; exploring expanded bus provision off-island.

Report received from City Cllr Martin Parsons: -

- Council has requested an urgent review of signage.
- Government housing targets cannot be ignored; rules keep shifting toward developers.
- Councils risk losing planning powers if they lack a local plan or refuse too many applications. Basildon, Uttlesford and Epping Forest have already had powers removed.
- Developments over 150 homes must now be referred to the Secretary of State.
- Without a local plan, large schemes (400–500 homes) could be approved by default.
- Island policy was approved in June.
- Regulation 19 consultation likely to be considered at the August meeting.

Report received from City Cllr Carl Powling: -

- Councillors support issuing a formal thank-you statement.
- Government warns housing cannot proceed without secure water supply.
- Meeting being arranged with Anglian Water on supply and infrastructure. Anglian Water exploring desalination and upgrades at Ardleigh/Colchester.
- Ongoing issues with Anglian Water roadworks causing major disruption.
- Co-op parking stay increased to 60 minutes; aim is 90.
- Measures introduced to stop all-day beach parking in Co-op car park.
- Tablet to be installed at doctors/dentists for easier parking registration; review in September.
